I am Rev Richard Kilgour. I was appointed as Rector of our church in February 2018. Holy Trinity Church, Crawford Street is a church presently run by a small group of people — our vestry committee, and was established in the 1860's. We are shaping a vision to better serve the local community. Holy Trinity Church is a charity registered in Scotland (SC023273). Our hall is a hidden gem in the Conservation Area. We have good hall facilities that we believe should be better used to build community locally. This is our **Community Access Project.** We are looking for your help with our **survey**.

Over the years we have included the wider community in using our hall with various activities including, residents group, indoor bowls, lunch club, social events, also youth activities including taekwondo, dancing classes, and e.g. Boys Brigade. With up to date access facilities we believe our hall particularly can provide a good centre for a lot of local community based activities and developments that **need space to thrive**. We now have planning and all consents for practical alterations for a fully accessible community space.










In the local news we learn that some Community Centres are closing or reducing opening hours due to funding cuts. We want to make the best use of this hall in the community, and we are investing time, energy and money to make it work.

The Vestry committee of the congregation has organised a **small survey** to get some basic up to date information about local needs. With this snapshot we will have a better idea for planning and mobilising organisations with input and support especially to get the best use out of these facilities. We believe that by supporting or resourcing local people and local need we can better serve the area. The results will be presented in August at the hall in an open meeting on Sat. **25th August 2.00pm.**

Within ½ mile of our Hall (marked with star on the map) we have a growing community with new and established homes. There are limited facilities close-by for people to meet and build community.
