The Gospel: Luke 21.5–19

5 When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, Jesus said, 6 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.' 7 They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this



be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' 8 And Jesus said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am

Resource Efficient
Scotland – Meeting with
Holy Trinity
Wednesday 13th Nov.

Several members joined Lachlan Kirk for a discussion of the energy saving measures recommended in the recent report on the church by Resource Efficient Scotland. They found potential for £7,911 of annual savings (9.6 tonnes CO2)

The most significant saving would be made in being able to heat the church with a gas boiler if gas supply could be restored and a new gas boiler fitted. Other measures included insulation throughout the buildings especially in the hall and church in the underfloor spaces. The meeting also heard about possible use of solar panels and 'air source heat pumps'. There was also information given about the 100% interest free loans available to us and cashback incentives of 15% on some measures. The Vestry will consider decisions and plans about this.
